Susan Ann Elizabeth was second of nine children, all born in Nova Scotia, Canada. At age Twenty-three, she married Charles Brady. They were parents of one daughter, before the untimely death of Charles.

Susan Ann Elizabeth converted to the Church of Jesus Christ, joined a wagon train from Canada and came to Utah, settling in Goshen, where she married a second time, September 28, 1852, to Henry Lyman Cook.

They made their home in Cedar City for the birth of two children. They returned to Goshen, where two more children joined their family. They were some of the first settlers to Goshen, and as such, had the responsibility for community and church functions.

Susan was a hard worker and a good mother. She was a widow once again when Henry passed away. Her children were young but she was very resourceful and independent and raised them on her own.

Susan was a widow for thirty-six years, passing away at the age of eighty-eight. She is buried beside Henry in the Goshen Cemetery.
