Born in Grantsville on April 23, 1862. She was a daughter of John Samuel and Nancy Bailey Steele. The family moved to Goshen in 1865 and she lived there all her life until coming to Ogden.

She was married in Santaquin in 1879. Mrs. Cook was prominent in Church work.

Surviving are six sons and daughters: Henry L., George A. and L. Deloy Cook, Goshen; Mrs. Virginia Carlson, Eureka; Mrs. Maud Jaspersen, Orem, and Mrs. Beck, Ogden: 17 grandchildren; nine great grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild; also eight brothers and sisters: John, William, Charles, Leonard and Chester Steele, Goshen; Brigham Steele, Orem; Mrs. Susan Elton, Mammoth, and Mrs. Mina Davey, Eureka.

Funeral services will be conducted Wednesday at 2 p.m. in the Goshen ward chapel with Bishop Rex White officiating. Friends may call at the Deseret mortuary in Payson Monday evening, and at the home of her son, George A. Cook, in Goshen Tuesday after 10 a.m., and Wednesday until time of services. Burial will be in Goshen cemetery.
